Summer Fun Idea from Wildlife Hero Camp

Solar S'Mores

You don't need a campfire to make S'mores!
Here is a fun way to make them in your backyard
with a pizza box and the sun!

You Need: An empty pizza box, scissors, aluminum foil, black paper, a stick to hold the box lid up.

S'more supplies: graham crackers, chocolate pieces, marshmallows

Step One:

Cut a big smile at the front of the pizza box lid. Put the foil inside the lid and tuck into the smile to hold in place.

Step Two: Put the black paper on the bottom of the box.

Step Three: Put a piece of graham cracker and a marshmallow on the black paper.

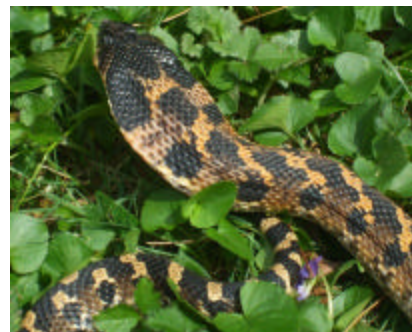
Step Four: Place the box with the opening facing the sun and prop the lid up with the stick. Leave for 20 minutes.

Step Five: Put another graham cracker in the box with a piece of chocolate on top. Leave for a couple of minutes.

Answer: Eastern Hognose Snake

ANIMAL FACT

The Eastern Hognose snake
A local species that is non-venomous. It gets its name from the turned up, pig-like nose that it uses to dig for toads.

When threatened the snake will spread and flatten it's head to try and look like a cobra. It may strike but will eventually roll over and play "dead."
